

Vocational Education and Training Network Session 1 Summary

Hosted by Michaela Hosking, Holmesglen Institute and Student Voice Australasia

The inaugural session brought together VET professionals from several Australian states to discuss the challenges unique to the VET sector when embedding student voice initiatives institutionally and sharing successful initiatives in the sector.

IDENTIFIED CHALLENGES:

- The impact is difficult to measure.
- Course duration varies drastically.
- Securing resourcing and funding.
- Building & maintaining momentum
- Contrast in experience in dual mode institutions.
- Diversity in the modes of delivery.
- Low buy-in from students.
- Achieving cultural mindset and commitment from others in the organisation.
- Consistency in practice at multi-campus institutions.
- Diverse student profiles.
- Scale and pace. Too much to tackle, and where to start that can be efficient but meaningful.

Staying mindful of existing practices that can embed student voice initiatives or complement student voice practices.
